Todd Staples: Staples is president of the Texas Oil & Gas Association, the state's oldest and largest trade association representing every facet of the oil and gas industry, including small independents, major producers, pipelines and refineries. Staples was twice elected statewide to serve as the Texas Agriculture Commissioner. He served with distinction as a member of the Texas Senate and House and began his elected service on the city council in his hometown of Palestine. Today, Staples continues his passion to help make the Lone Star State the best place to do business and raise a family.

Daryl Mazzanti: Mazzanti is president of GARP (Gas Assisted Rod Pump), inventor of the GARP® technology, serves as president of GARP Services, LLC, and as President of its parent company, Well Lift, Inc. He joined Evolution Petroleum in 2005 and served as the Executive VP of Operations until January 2016. His work experience as an engineer and engineering manager in the Austin Chalk Field peaked his interest in liquid loading problems encountered by the unique geometry of horizontal wells. After he joined Evolution, he designed the GARP® technology to assist Evolution's own horizontal wells in the Giddings Austin Chalk Field.

Allen Howard: Howard is president/chief executive officer NuTech Energy, a company he founded in 1998. Through Howard's leadership, NUTECH has grown to include five offices, and has become the recognized industry leader in reservoir characterization and reservoir engineering providing the oil and gas industry a clear understanding of the attributes that affect reservoir production. He played an integral role in guiding Numar's development from a startup company through full product development, commercialization, a successful IPO, and ultimately a successful sale to Halliburton.

Robert Baumgardener: Baumgardener works for the Bureau of Economic Geology at the University of Texas at Austin and has worked in the Mudrock Systems Research Lab group at the bureau looking at cores and well logs from the southern Midland Basin. Together with senior author Scott Hamlin, Baumgardener is co-author of the Bureau's Report of Investigations No. 277 "Wolfberry (Wolfcampian-Leonardian) Deep-Water Depositional Systems in the Midland Basin: Stratigraphy, Lithofacies, Reservoirs, and Source Rocks" which won the 2014 Charles J. Mankin Award from the Association of American State Geologists as the best publication by a state geological survey in the fields of regional, energy and mineral resource geology.

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
